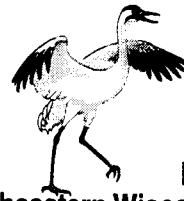

Have a gloomy outlook on the future of planet Earth? If so, this program will adjust your attitude as we look at exciting changes in industry and culture that will eventually save and restore our environment. Nearly-pollution-free cars, solar carpets, and energy-producing homes, bicycle and pedestrian friendly, and waste minimizing community planning and other environmentally friendly responses are just around the corner.

Larry Smith, professor of social change, development and economics at UW-Green Bay, will talk about these and other examples of environmentally positive products and behaviors coming from many realms, and now made accessible in the just-released book, Natural Capitalism, by Paul Hawken, Amory Lovins and L. Hunter Lovins. He will help us understand the principles of natural capitalism, also called sustainable or ecological economics, and what these new possibilities will mean to our lives. Dr. Smith is offering a university class on sustainable development starting this fall and works extensively with sustainable development and community issues in Green Bay and Door County.

This meeting will be held at the Downtown Brown County Library from 7 to 8:45 p.m. We will meet in rooms #1 & #2 in the lower level. Doors open at 6:30 p.m.

NEW Audubon Spring Fling at THE FARM
Saturday, April 8 1:00 p.m.

It's an afternoon full of learning and tasty treats. You'll see demonstrations of the science and art of making maple syrup and sugar, make and eat jack wax, and enjoy a snack of flapjacks and aebleskivers drenched in homemade maple syrup. You can also see an authentic sugar shack and maple syrup arch, a badger den, a maple-beech-hemlock climax forest, a Lake Algonquin shoreline, a prairie in April, possibly see a pileated woodpecker (it's ideal habitat for pileated woodpeckers), and learn the history of America's most famous food item.

THE FARM is located four miles north of Sturgeon Bay on Hwy 57.

Garlic Mustard Pulling Party
Saturday, April 29 9:00 a.m.

Garlic mustard may be our biggest invasive plant threat to woodlands. Learn about the biology of the plant and join our plant pulling party on April 29 at Lost Dauphin State Park. We'll be done by noon.

Lost Dauphin State Park is located five miles south of De Pere on Lost Dauphin Road just before you get to Little Rapids. Look for cars in a small parking lot on the west side of the road. Dress for weather. Contact Paul Hartman at 391-4610 for more information.

Froggin' at Barkhausen Waterfowl Preserve

Two indoor orientation sessions featuring live frogs and their calls followed by a night hike to listen to frog breeding calls on the Barkhausen trails are set for May 4.

7:00 to 7:45 p.m. - Inside with live frogs and their calls for children 12 years and under with parent(s), followed by hike until 8:45 p.m.

7:45 to 8:30 p.m. - Indoor session for kids over 12 and adults, followed by night hike until 9:30 p.m.

There is a \$2 per person fee (\$1 to Barkhausen, \$1 to Cowpie Amphibian Conservation Fund). There is a limit of 50 people per session. Pre-registration is required. Call Brown County Park Department at 448-6242 to register.
